

## ANNUAL TECHNICAL INSPECTION Revised 3-9-2010

A: LVR Region may impose restrictions on the Annual Technical Inspection program, limiting the classes allowed to participate and/or restricting it to experienced drivers.

**The following items apply:** The person applying for a Yearly Inspection Certificate must be a LVR SCCA member in good standing, have a current copy of the SOLO rules, have an approved helmet, and must have verifiable proof of a full year of Solo experience within the LVR or other SCCA National Region Clubs.

B: An experienced inspector appointed by the Regional Solo chairperson must conduct the Annual Technical Inspection. For the 2010 year the following approved Solo Inspectors are:

C: The SCCA member presenting the vehicle for inspection is required to **possess a current copy of the National Solo Rules**. These rules may be in the form of a hard-copy book, a print out from the SCCA national web site, a disk containing the rules or a computer which has the rules on a drive. Stated in another way, the member must have demonstrable and current access to the SCCA SOLO rules.

The LVR Annual Tech Sticker shall be unique and non-transferable and shall display the current competition year.

The LVR Annual Tech Sticker will be placed on the upper left corner of the windshield of the annually inspected vehicle.

An Annual Tech Card will be issued to the driver and may be presented in lieu of the Tech Sticker. It may also be used to obtain a replacement Annual Tech Sticker in the event that the Annual Tech Sticker is damaged or otherwise rendered unreadable.

The LVR Annual Tech Sticker and Card shall be signed and dated by the LVR Chief of Technical Inspection or his/her designee. This Inspection sticker and card will be good for the competition year or until the final version of the subsequent years rules are released by the National office.

If, during registration, you have been selected by the registrar to be randomly inspected you must find a Tech Inspector to check your vehicle. Failing to do so will place you on suspension for twelve months from the day of missed random inspection. ***We will inspect several vehicles per year on a random basis.***

D: The vehicle should be presented for Annual Technical Inspection in the same condition that it will compete. It is the responsibility of the competitor to maintain the vehicle in substantially the same condition for each event. Las Vegas Region will inspect each vehicle within this program once a year. The vehicle may be selected for additional inspections on a random basis.

E. It is the responsibility of all competitors driving a vehicle with an Annual Tech Sticker to verify that the vehicle is in compliance with all items listed in the National Solo Rule Book Sec: 3.3.3.

If during a random inspection, the Tech Inspector determines that the vehicle is not compliant with paragraph 3.3.3, then the competitor will be placed on probation for a full twelve-month period and cannot participate in the Annual Tech Inspection program until the suspension is lifted.

F: The event technical inspector or chairperson may require a vehicle be presented for re-inspection if there is good reason to believe that a vehicle is not in compliance with the sections of 3.3.3.

G: If, after receiving an Annual Technical Inspection, the vehicle is substantially changed or modified the owner/driver must resubmit the vehicle for inspection.

This policy will be self-policed. However, if it is determined that during a random inspection and/or a formal complaint is received from a competitor that a vehicle has been substantially modified and has not been re-submitted for inspection to approve such modifications then, the vehicle and driver will be suspended from the Annual Technical Inspection Program for twelve months.

H: An official SCCA Annual Helmet Tech sticker may be affixed to helmets meeting the current standards in order to easily identify eligible helmets.

Only helmets meeting the current rule requirements within the Solo Rule book page will be permitted for use. Approved and annually inspected helmets may have an inspection sticker applied to the left side of the helmet. All drivers may have a current helmet tech sticker applied to the left side of the helmet.

I: **Eligibility** This yearly Technical Inspection program is strictly voluntary however, the following criteria must be met in order to participate.

- The eligible driver must be a Las Vegas Region SCCA member in good standing.
- The eligible vehicle must have a demonstrated record of reliability.
- The eligible vehicle must have a demonstrated record of safety.
- Vehicles which are considered to be “under development” by the SOLO Chair or his designee are not eligible for this program.

- Since this program is voluntary and since participation is considered a privilege, participation in the program shall be at the sole discretion of the SOLO Chair or his designee. Updated March 9, 2010.
